BISHOPSWOOD, LYDBROOK

Detached Victorian cottage

We have done both indoor and outdoor work here in the last few months. The newly painted surfaces include the corbels (white) and the back door (Monarch red). We have built a tall utility cupboard in the back section of the kitchen to house the boiler, washing machine and tumble dryer, and have now moved upstairs to install the bathroom suite.

Our single biggest undertaking at Bishopswood recently has been to repair the exterior front wall above the dining room windows. This required scaffolding, dry weather,

steady nerves and more than one head for heights! Fortunately these various elements came together for us and we were able to proceed.

First we removed the old render to reveal the underlying wooden frame. This was then covered with plywood, a waterproof membrane and a metal screen before being finished with Tyrolean render.

2-bedroom cottage

The front of this cottage transformed when we pulled down the hideous old lean-to shed. In time, we will build a set of wide steps leading down from the street level to the front door. The cottage now has new windows and French doors, and a specially designed staircase made in idigbo - an African hardwood that the ioiner recommended because it wears Idigbo is similar to oak in well. appearance.

The interior walls have been plasterboarded, plastered and skimmed, ready for painting. The electrician has done his second fix and the gas meter has been moved to join the new meter box. We expect the electricity meter to follow suit in mid-October.

Many years ago Mary Parker Follett (1868-1933) wrote: "It seems to me that whereas power usually means power-over, the power of some person or group over some other person or group, it is possible to develop the

conception of power-with, a jointly developed power, a co-active, not a coercive power." Follett's thinking was well ahead of her time. Her pioneering work on management laid the foundation for many later thinkers and practitioners, inspiring Peter Drucker to call her "a prophet of management".
